He had reached a point in life where he could give an amount he had always wanted to give. On Saturday he wrote out a \$1,000 check he was going to put in the plate in church on Sunday. Sunday could not get here quick enough. When the time came, no one else in church knew or saw it happen. “HIDDEN BENEFITS” OF THE “PRISON BIBLE” AND THE “NATIONAL JAIL-PRISON DIRECTORY”

Many fruitful ministries and individual Christians are engaged in the very valuable but often unseen work of sending Bibles and study courses into jails and prisons through the U.S. Postal Service. Studies sent by mail reach prisoners in places that in-prison volunteers cannot go. This ministry then notifies others whose ministry is on the “inside” when a correspondence student needs to be prayed with or assisted in being baptized into Christ.

Few fully understand the cost of a “Study-by-Mail” program. In addition to Bibles, tracts, and lessons, there is the cost of paper, envelopes, and most of all—always rising postage expense! Some ministries have a few dozen students and others have hundreds or even thousands, or tens of thousands.



Our newly printed “**Prison Bible**” offers a variety of **free** study courses to prisoners who will send requests to our Corpus Christi office and studies will be mailed from here. This helps a local “Study-by-Mail” program maintain a more manageable and cost-effective workload locally. We are not suggesting that any stop the good work being done. Simply *let us expand your impact*.

Other excellent “in-prison” ministries are unable to offer free Bible courses by mail. Their time, volunteer teachers, in-person study materials, travel and fuel costs are all they can manage to do. However, by distributing the *Prison Bible* to students, many will “sign up” for our free studies by correspondence and send their requests to our Corpus Christi office. This expands their impact *without* damaging their workload or budget.

This is where the “National Directory of Churches of Christ & Individual Christians Involved in Jail/Prison Ministries” enters the picture. We need every ministry to be listed (congregation, volunteers, names, addresses, cellphones, email addresses, contact person, ministry leader) so we can most effectively network to the glory of God and win more souls to Christ *while it is still day*. It helps for each to define itself by telling what you do and *where* you do it. When there is a specific need for what *your* ministry does, information may be sent to YOU by others and vice-versa.



Also, when a Bible Study-by-Mail Ministry has a need that some other ministry can help with; they will be contacted. Some only minister to women, men, children/juveniles, families, mentoring, addiction recovery, pen-pals, sex-offenders, halfway or sober living houses, re-entry (transportation, clothes, food, employment) and/or finding their place and becoming involved in the work of a local congregation. Other ministries send in a singing group, conduct Sunday worship, teach weekday or night classes, set geographical limits (county, state or other boundaries such as “no sex-offenders”). It is helpful to know these in advance to maximize time, energy and cost.



THE NEW “PARENTING MATTERS” WORKBOOK

We recently exhausted our supply of bound workbooks for the popular series —“Parenting Matters.” This is normally not viewed as a *good* thing. However —since it requires us to review every word in the course—we are given an opportunity to update it and, hopefully, improve it in ways that enhances its positive impact on students in the classroom. In time, we will also add these changes to the material on the flash drive for license-holders who choose to print out lesson copies for classroom use or for a correspondence program. But first things first . . . the “new” bound student workbooks will be ready by April 15 at the same \$12 each rate plus shipping. Unless we are only sending a single copy, we ship UPS (at our cost) so remember it is less expensive when shipped to a “business” address rather than to a residence. You may further reduce the per-book shipping if ordering by the case. We cannot project the number of books per case until we receive them from the printer on the 15th.
